For our October autocross we were fortunate to have great weather, brand new timing lights, and a new timing system to help manage our event. Although we did have a few glitches, the end result was a much better day. There were fewer missed runs, and because the new lights are strong enough to work in direct sunlight up to 50 feet apart, we were able to position them farther apart to avoid

any kind of accident should a driver run wide at the finish.

Throughout most of 2000, we have enjoyed a series of extraordinarily large courses by autocross standards. This is made possible by the tremendous size of our location. When I browse the Web to see autocross results in other regions and other clubs I'm always surprised to see 35 second runs, sometimes 40 or 45 seconds. Our club has been laying out tracks that average 60 to 70 seconds for

each run. While I do enjoy the longer tracks, there is something to be said for the "short but sweet" tracks of old. For October our neat little track consisted of a wonderful combination of tight slaloms. medium speed sweeping turns, and some very technical sections.

As the first group started their runs through the track we realized this was going to be a very quick

A Winner at Last: Bob Sato Finishes First By Ed Kemper

The final SCCA regional race at HRP for the season on the last Sunday of October saw the hard luck racer of the last millennium win his first one in 4 years. Bob Sato has had about every imaginable part break on his modified Formula Ford over the last half decade. There was never any question he was fast, the real issue was whether he would finish. And for many, many races he did not. As a result Bob became gun shy--- he would not practice and sometimes would not even attempt to qualify, all in hopes of the finishing the race.

The October race was not different. No practice at all and only 5 laps of qualifying and then only at a limited speed. Thus the stage was set for the classic Sato charge from the back of the pack, only to have the car break some critical part.

The Formula Ford field was particularly strong at this race. Bill Clutter, former owner of the Skip Barber School, was back. David Goto just picked up a new Van Diemen Ford and was surely going to be a contender. Steve Timpson, the winner of the last couple of Formula Ford races, was certainly not to be

course. Most of the stock cars were able to keep the their best times under 60 seconds and the Street prepared and modified would be even faster! The competition in B stock was very close with six Miatas and one BMW Z3 vying for fastest times. It shaped up into quite a battle between Panos Prevedourous' Miata and George Adkins' Z3. Panos ran his fastest time in his second run and George was unable to top that till his very last run to take top honors in B stock with a 55.373. F stock was similar to B stock with seven Camaros ganging up on one lonely Mustang. In the end, Richard Takaba's Camaro would win the class with a best time of 56.436. Jon Matsushige (Camaro) was just a second behind Richard all afternoon to finish second in class.

There were a total of ten drivers in Datsun 240Zs (spread over several classes), and not surprisingly Curtis Lee was the quickest among them with a third run of 50.641. CSP and DSP were business as usual for Ken Van Orman and Cliff Goto who both won their respective classes. In FSP there are now 5 drivers in Toyota Corollas, and Keith Binning came out on top with a 54.626. It sure is fun to watch those older rear-wheel-drive Toyotas drift through the corners, though Dean Kawasaki sets the standard for Corollas with a 51.931, and his car never slides!

STS has been Subaru City for most of this year, but for some reason we only had four Imprezas in STS this month and only one in STR. But STR was where the quickest Subaru came from. Earl Huang may have been the fastest STS car with his 55.266, but Tim Wolf was almost 3 seconds clear of Earl with a Subaru fastest time of 52.513. With all the competition among the Subarus, it's easy to forget that Gavin Lee still eclipsed all of them to win STS with his Acura Integra.

counted out. Newcomer Alan Zane finished very strongly in the last race and therefore was also a contender. Unfortunately, Stephan Hirasuna broke his rear suspension during practice and he was out for the day and the race.

Qualifying had Clutter first, followed by Timpson, Goto, Zane and Sato taking up the rear. But as to Sato, as the saying goes, not for long. At the green flag, Sato with the 2000cc Ford engine (the rest having 1600 cc Ford engines) took off and passed everyone at the end of the straight before the first turn. Before long he stretched out a decent led over Clutter, waiting for the "bad luck hammer" to drop. It did not. Sato won with Clutter in second.

The real racing was between Timpson and Goto and it was a typical nose to tail race for the 21 minute event. On lap four Goto was going to make either a brilliant or vastly stupid pass just before the reverse camber turn. Timpson give Goto an ever so slight opening and Goto pulled next to him going into the tight and very narrow turn. In a word he got by the smallest of margins. The rest of the race was Timpson trying to get by without any success. Zane had a clean run and finished 5th.

The closed wheel race was a good deal less exciting. The three top qualifiers finished in the order of qualifying --- Scott Schulte (Porsche 911), Wes Aihara (CRX) and Ed Kemper (Mustang). The only real drama was the approaching rain the first few laps. Both Wes and Ed were hoping for rain since were not on slicks and more importantly they had working windshield wipers. But it was not to be. Other than a few drops on the windshield there was no rain to be had.

Solo 1 only had two potential starters Lindsey Akamu (Porsche 911) and Tom Eschvert (Sports S 2000). Tom had terminal braking problems and had to withdraw. Lindsey turned a terrific 1:02.798 for his single fastest lap.

After the races, the course was shortened for some lapping by street cars. For fifty bucks or for free for the corner workers and drivers could race the course for 10 to 20 laps. The next race should have even more short track testers.
