#### Team Goto Wins The Regional ... Sort Of

Although the racing field was somewhat smaller because the regional wheel to wheel race was on a Saturday, the head to head competition was better in both the open wheel and door slammers divisions. Because of limited date availability at Hawaii Raceway Park, the first 2001 race occurred on Saturday, February 24th. Even though

there were no Solo 1 entrants with Lindsay Akamu and Ron Mishima both working on their Porsches, there were five track day drivers who probably put 30 to 40 laps on the short course for \$50 or less. They had a blast.

Practice and qualifying were largely uneventful except for Ed Kemper's spin at the end of the straight during qualifying. He ended up facing his fellow racers as they braked for turn one, at least until his Mustang restarted. As has been the case for a number of years, Scott Schulte in his Porsche was on the pole with a 57 second lap. The rest were more closely bunched up. Wes Aihara (CRX) and Lee Guertler, in his new Datsun 240z, were 2 and 3 after qualifying. Keith Williams, in the David Goto Mazda RX-7, was next, followed by Kemper.

As was expected after the flag flew, Schulte took off and ultimately lapped the field. The real battle was in the middle of the pact between Aihara, Guertler and Williams. Even though Aihara was on the outside pole, at the start both Guertler and Williams got by him at the first turn at the end of the straight. But Aihara was not going to be deterred by this little set back. First, he got caught up with Guertler and passed him and then set his sights on Williams. What followed was a series of passes and repasses between those two. Finally, on about the 20<sup>th</sup> lap of 27 lap feature, Keith missed a shift on the back straight and the CRX got by him and Wes never was bested and finished second.

Team Goto had two cars in the Formula Ford race, one driver by David Goto himself and the other rented by Chris Messer. In qualifying, Dave was third best with a 58.3 and Chris had a fourth place slot with a 58.6. Bob Sato, our winner of the last Formula race of 2000, was on the pole with a 56.9 remembering that Bob is running a larger engine than the rest of the field. The out-

side pole found Thomas Ito who had turned a 57.9. Rounding out the rest of the pack was Stephen Hirasuna and Alan Zane.

Assuming Sato could hold together everyone expected the racing to be for second place. It did not turn out that way. On the first lap, Sato was in last place by turn two either because of design or some unexplained mishap. So initially, Chris Messer was leading with Sato coming up through the group. By lap three, Sato was in 4<sup>th</sup> place, then in 3<sup>rd</sup> by lap 4, and in first by lap 5. Meanwhile, team leader Goto got by Messer. But on lap seven just before the reverse camber turn, Sato's motor mount broke and he could not shift gears, and at roughly the same spot Tom Ito's engine developed a huge miss. The end result was a lot of pushing and shoving by the other drivers trying to get through.

Literally after the dust cleared, Messer lead Goto by a couple of feet for about 12 laps with Hirasuna and Zane tagging along. But on lap 19 and this time in the reverse chamber turn Goto made his move with an inside pass and a light touch which forced Messer into some agricultural racing and Goto forged ahead. But not by much. With less than 6 laps left, there are two more passes, with some side pod touches, among the leaders with Messer finally making it stick at the very end to take the win by .470 of a second. Thus, Team Goto won but not with its fearless leader in first.

Then the workers and others turned out for track day on the short course, some with instructors and some without. Passing was only permitted on the straight by the stands. Since this racing experience is the bargain of the century (less than 70 cents a lap), SCCA can expect a lot more short trackers for the April 29<sup>th</sup> event at Hawaii Raceway Park.
