
After a slight "mishap" in June, Gabe Hanohano returned to take 1st in H Stock (Ok so there only 2 cars, but a win is a

Curtis Lee once again took BSP, with daughter Jennifer only 1.1 seconds behind. Garret Chew took third. Dean Kawasaki returned this month and took top honors in CSP with a 39.249. Jason Dovgan came in second with a 40.508 and Robert Casteel was third with a 44.065.

Cliff Goto drove his Dodge Neon R/T to a win in a hotly contested DSP with a 41.175. John Davis was a mere 0.43 seconds behind, and third place Gary Kitagawa was 0.24 seconds behind John. In another hotly contested class, ESP, Scott Presson won by 0.312 sec-

onds over Rano Keliikuli's 43.829. Rano just edged out Neal Arakaki by 0.014 seconds!

Keith Binning won FSP with a 40.653 over Robert Hechtmen and Jack Evans. Reid Morimoto drove his Acura Type R to a win in GS over Tyrone Montayre's Audi TT and Kelly Lee's A4. Jon Matsushige drove his way to a win in SM with Richard Crabbe and Ted Hightower rounding out the top three.

Panos Prevedourous put a "serious hurt" on everyone in BS with his 39.156. In fact, he "hurt" 76 drivers because his time was the 3rd fastest overall!



In the battle of the all-wheel drive class, STS, Earl Huang and his Audi TT clocked a 40.701, over Joseph Battista's 41.193. Francis Lining was third only 0.034 seconds behind.

Waialae Subaru Driver Training

Although this was not a regular SCCA event, we were asked to provide instruction and logistical support for this all-Subaru event. Chris Morley the General Manager at Waialae Subaru organized the event and rented the track for the day in order to provide his customers with an opportunity to flex their cars potential in a controlled environment.

As usual, the morning exercises consisted of a Slalom, Threshold Braking, Emergency Lane Change Maneuver and a Kidney Bean Skidpad. The participants were split into two groups with one going to the main straight to work on the slalom, lane change and braking. The other would explore the skidpad.

After a wonderful catered lunch courtesy of the DRIV-ERS Foundation (**D**riving **R**esponsibly **I**n **V**ehicles for Enhanced **R**oad **S**afety). The participants were split into two groups for timed runs though the short course with a few modifications. In order to make sure the event fell within the SCCA Solo II rules, our Safety Steward needed to approve the track layout, and several chicanes were installed to slow the cars down and limit the top speeds. The track was too long to walk,

After two practice runs with instructors in the car, the first group went out to for their four times runs. Despite the urgings that this was not a competition, a trend started to emerge. Chris Morley emerged from the first round with a 53.098. As the next group started, it was obvious they had been watching the earlier runs since they were immediately quicker. Bob Nakamura ran consistent 51s and 53s finishing with a best of 50.912. This

The top times went to Arian Yee (WRX) with a 49.530, Panos Prevedouros (Mazda Miata) with a 49.366, Earl Huang (WRX), with a 48.942, Colin Sato (Honda S2000) with a 48.470, and Curtis Lee (Datsun 240Z) leading the pack with a 46.211.

The PAX Index is an autocross handicapping system designed to allow comparison between the various SCCA Solo II classes. The PAX numbers represent times that should be run by cars developed to the limit of the rules <u>and</u> driven by national caliber drivers. The PAX Index is updated each year to account for rule changes and is based on major events, including the SCCA Solo II Nationals, where there are plenty of fully prepared cars in the hands of top quality drivers.

To use the Index, multiply a given time by the class index number to get an indexed time. For example, if a CS car runs a time of 43.500, its indexed time is 34.887 ($43.500 \times .802$). If on the same course, an ASP car runs a time of 41.000, its indexed time is 34.932 ($41.000 \times .852$). In this case, the CS competitor performed the best.
